The historic Million Man March, which drew nearly two million Black men to the steps of Congress, brought about an unprecedented wave of activism in the Black Community throughout America. The Million Man March 10-year commemoration has brought together a powerful and diverse coalition of leadership and organizations that are seriously concerned about the plight of Black people in America and worldwide. The Millions More Movement, and its ambitious agenda, is shaping up to be a massive gathering/movement and a real answer to the critical challenges facing our community. Women are invited to the gathering which will include all sectors of the Black national and international community. The focus will be Hurricane Katrina and Reparations
